But as God calls us one by one, the chain will link again.

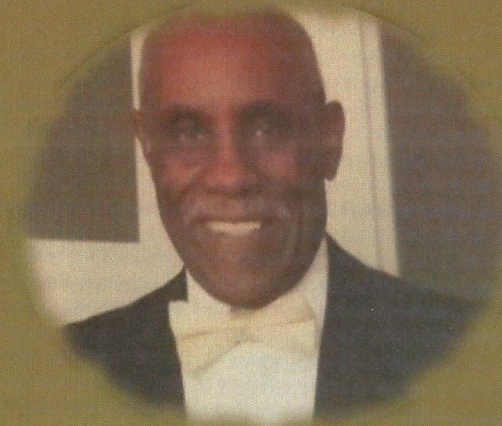
