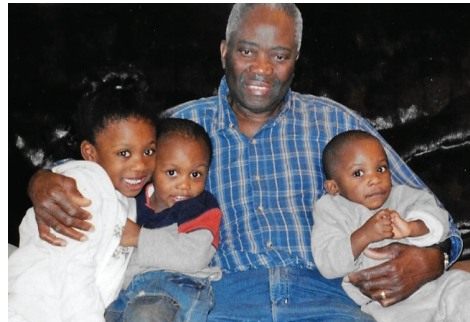

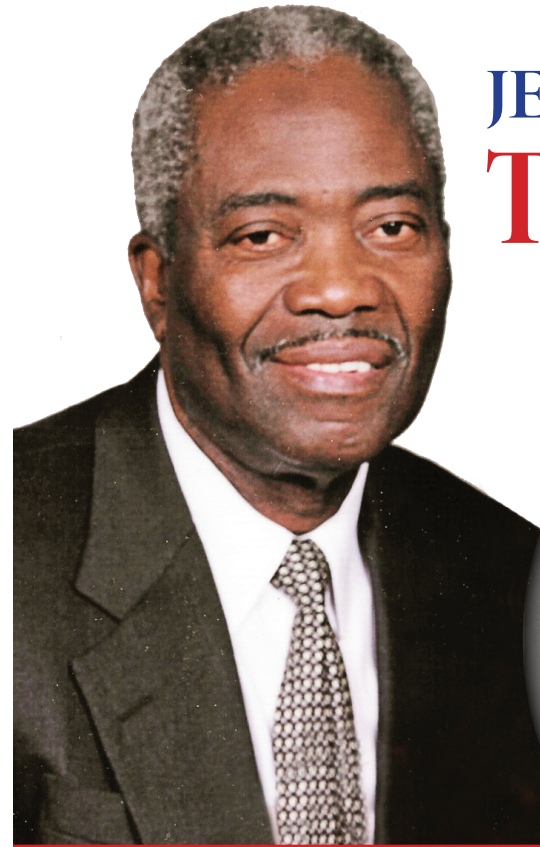

OBITUARY

Jerry D. Thompson also known as “J.D.” was the youngest of ten siblings born to Alfred Thompson and Lugenia Gibbons Thompson of Louisville, Georgia. He departed this life on Tuesday, April 14, 2015.

He graduated from Wadley High School in 1947 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He served in the Korean War where he rose to the rank of



Chief Petty Officer and received an honorable discharge. Upon leaving the Navy he relocated to White Plains, NY. In later years, he reconnected with his fellow service men and was a charter member of the USS Arnold J Isbell DD869 reunion group.

After obtaining a certificate of carpentry from the Manhattan Trade Center, he established and maintained a successful business for over 50 years; specializing in carpentry and custom cabinet making. Jerry was known for his workmanship and creative talent which he shared with the church and local community.

He met then married Irene A. McCants on September 5, 1959. This union was blessed with two children Darryl and Kim. He has three grandchildren whom he loved and adored.
