Professor Eileen Edgerton Perry, was born on September 28, 1936, in Mt. Pleasant, New York, to the parents of Burl Edgerton Sr. and Katie Coles Watson Edgerton, both of whom have predeceased her also. She departed this life on Sunday, December 6, 2020. At the time of her demise, she was a resident of White Plains, New York.

She received her formal education in the public schools of Greenburgh, New York and White Plains, New York. She continues her college education by attending the Westchester Community College (WCC) in Valhalla New York and received an Associate in Applied Science Degree in Business Secretarial; Pace University in White Plains New York, where she received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Education and the Long Island University (LIU) in Dobbs Ferry New York, where she was inducted into Alpha Phi Sigma, The National Criminal Justice Honor Society. She received her Masters Degree with the Major in Criminal Justice. Eileen received her teacher certifications from the State of Connecticut and the New York State Education Department.

Eileen was a professor and student advisor at the college of Westchester formerly the Westchester business institute (WBI) in White Plains New York, in the office of technology department. She was a former employee at the Katherine Gibbs school in Norwalk Connecticut where she served as an acting dean of secretarial studies, coordinator of the adult training program and the future secretary association and an instructor. She was also employed as an instructor by the board of education of White Plains New York for the White Plains adult education center and by the board of cooperative education. She was a notary public in Westchester and a Tax Preparer.

Her affiliations were not limited to the church itself, for she was the director of the Westchester community organization (WCO), a volunteer for and in honor of the stroke persons of Westchester organization for many years, and the recipient of various merit awards and the certificates of appreciation - too numerous to name.

Professor Perry was United in matrimony with the late Clarence H. Perry Jr. and to that union two daughters were born, Cynthia and Katherine.
